How can you shape the future when the people of your town can't stop talking about the past? 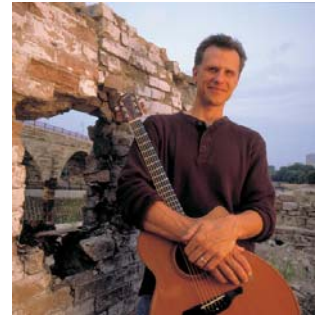

### Seek Green. Practice Green. Celebrate Green.

#### ***Thanks for the input!***

With spring looming around the corner many of us are thinking green. It's a good time of year to think of, and look forward to the things we appreciate in the natural world, and plan our gardens for the coming season. It is also a great time to thin about our impacts to our natural world. The Green Sanctuary Program (GSP) asks us all to consider the environment much more intentionally in all that we do. On February 7<sup>th</sup> the Green Team presented the basics of the GSP to the congregation. We received a very excited and positive reaction from those in attendance. We had time to break out into groups and brainstorm some action items we would like to see considered for our committee to work on as goals, and for projects.

To become a Green Sanctuary we need to create and implement an Action Plan consisting of 12 projects within 4 focus areas. Below are ideas from our HUUF community. Please feel free to share with the Green Team any ideas, concerns, or to ask questions at [bog.trotter@ymail.com](mailto:bog.trotter@ymail.com). Spring is just around the corner, everything will be greening, growing, and changing—we have the power to create change too.

#### **Worship & Celebration:**

- Have a service outside, and host events.
- Be aware of our environment, integrate this into all our celebrations.
- Create a “green” checklist to be considered for each HUUF event.
- Green the sanctuary—put some plants inside!
- Introduce Native American tradition of respecting the Earth.

#### **Religious Education:**

- Get kids outside & in touch with the environment (2).
- Environmental book club.
- Film series.
- Field trips: local farm, etc.
- Educational opportunities to integrate sustainability into daily life.

#### **Environmental Justice:**

- Tree planting, or the like—include kids, use HUUF banner (visible to community).
- Donate local foods to the food shelf/soup kitchen.
- Work on local issues—food, energy, social justice.
- Make Earth jewelry to sell, or donate to battered women's shelter
- Work with underserved groups—reach out and be consistent.

#### **Sustainable Living:**

- Garden/green space (2); rain garden/butterfly garden, compost (2)
- Using all environmentally friendly cleaning products (2).
- Explore energy audit (3).
- Install insulated/quilted panels on windows when church not in use.
- Use timers on thermostats—reduce waste.

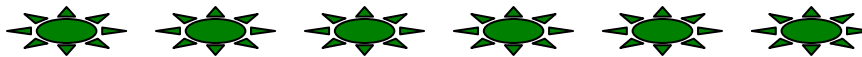
